the Hogan Administrative Building in La Crosse. That was agreed upon at the La Crosse School Board meeting Monday night. The district was awarded a \$175 thousand grant last year to plan for the new 7 Rivers Community Charter High School. Instructor Jason Wiggee says some time lines need to be hit before class planning with students and parents can began.
